Hours of Operation at the historic Harbourville United Church

Opening Day is Saturday, June 2nd 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. The market continues Saturdays throughout June, from 9 until 1 p.m. In July and August the market operates Fridays from 1 until 7 p.m.; Saturdays 9 until 5 p.m., and Sundays 1 until 5 p.m.

The Saturday market continues September and early October from 9 until 5 p.m., with the last day on Saturday Oct. 12.. The Christmas Artisan Market will be held on Nov. 17.

The Olde Weave Shoppe

Look to the north east corner of the church, the craft of fabric making is on display again this year. Newly decorated as an olde weave shoppe, the floor loom is in place, many different yarns are on display and a recreated viking costume made with handwoven linen and wool is displayed on the mannequin.

There is a warp on the loom and opportunity for anyone to sign on to weave a runner for yourself using whatever yarn you provide. Frequently, there will be someone present and available to assist you.

On July 21st, we will have a creating weaving workshop at the church. The plan is to do branch weaving, so if you find a branch which really speaks to you, save it and bring it along to the workshop.

The Seaside Park Hotel opened in Harbourville in 1910 on a hill overlooking the Bay of Fundy. It had

its beginnings in the 1840's as a 1 1/2 storey house built by Joshua Beardsley. Around the turn of the century Mrs. Idella Aker, widow of sea captain John Aker, operated a little summer hotel there known as the Hillside House.

While living in Halifax where Idella also operated the Berwick House Hotel, Idella met Edward Kappelle, a man who dreamt of one day having a luxurious seaside resort. Kappelle managed to head up a shareholders group in 1909. The group, the Harbourville Reality Company, was comprised of several accomplished business men. Together they provided financial backing for the seaside resort project. Shares were sold, many to Americans.

And so began the life of ...

If anyone is interested in purchasing the right to be buried in Burlington Cemetery, lots are available at a cost of \$250. The committee has developed guidelines for the Green Burial Ground that is adjacent to the north side of the original Burlington Cemetery. Green Burial refers to “*sustainable burial with minimal ecological impact*”. There was a community meeting on March 14, 2018 to discuss these new guidelines. At this meeting some points were amended. There have been 11 plots sold in the Green Burial Ground to date and much interest in this option. The cost is \$250. There have been no interments. 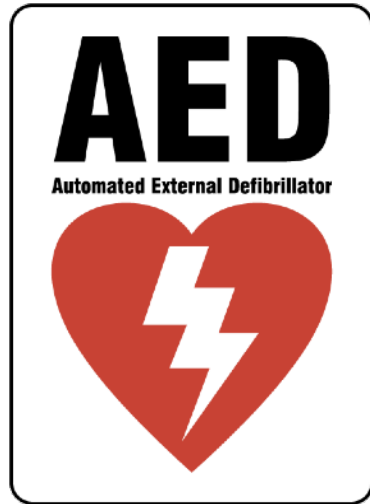


From the Brow to the Bay
